President's Report 2017

Dear Guests and Members,

Good evening. I am so delighted to welcome you all to our 2017 HKPUECA 18th Annual General Meeting and Gala Dinner.

Thanks for the help and support of our board members and many volunteers. Last year was a busy and dynamic year as we have participated in more than 10 events again.

On February 24, we hosted our annual Chinese New Year celebration with 150 guests including those from 8 other Universities of Hong Kong as well as those from our sister alumni association, the Social Work Alumni Association (HKPUSSW). At this dinner, we have raised \$2,750 for the Alumni Atrium in Hong Kong. Later, with Pauline Tsang's help, we have raise another \$10,000 HK for the Alumni Atrium. Thank you all for the solidarity and support.

On February 25, 10 of our current board members and their spouses attended the Chinese New Year celebration dinner hosted by our sister alumni association, HKPUSSW

I always encourage our board members to attend other universities' AGM's in order to show our support, such as the HKU AGM on April 2, and CU AGM on April 8.

With continued communication and dialogues with our sister alumni association, we were able to invite Mei-Ling Kwan, the current President of HKPUSSW to attend our board meeting on May 12. We were grateful for her agreeing to join our board to fill a vacancy as a result of the resignation of Elliot Tse immediately after the first board meeting.

We hosted many seminars on various interesting topics at the Markham Civic Centre, including the Joint and Bone Health seminar on April 16, and the Yoga and Pain Control seminar on June 11. They were well received with an average attendance of 70 people.

This year we participated in many outdoor activities. On May 14, we joined the charity Mother's Day Walk hosted by Mon Sheong Foundation and were able to raise more than \$2,430 for this worthy organization.

2017 marks the 150th anniversary of Canadian Confederation with Ontario as one of its 4 confederated provinces. In Hong Kong people are so thrilled to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the establishment of the Special Administrative Region of Hong Kong simultaneously. JointU of Hong Kong, an organization with 9 member universities, has decided to commemorate this year by planting 9 trees in a park in Canada and to host an event to break the Guinness Book of World Records.

On June 24, many of the alumni from the 9 universities from Hong Kong gathered together to plant 9 small trees representing the 9 universities and one bigger tree representing Canada in HENRY White Park on Moss Creek Blvd in the City of MARKHAM. We are scheduled to host the record breaking event at the PanAm Sports Centre later this year on October 15.

Towards the middle of summer, on July 22 we hosted a hike led by Dr. Raymond Wong. Thanks to our alumnus Tommy Chang, on July 29 many of our board members and their spouses visited Associated Tube Canada where he had worked for almost 30 years.

2017 also marks the 80th anniversary of Hong Kong Polytechnic University and 2 board members including Susan Wong and I will go back to Hong Kong to attend the 80th anniversary celebration on December 7 this year.

We have 7 regular members and 215 lifetime members. We are working hard to convince all the regular members to convert to life members over time.

On the administration side, the Board had passed 2 main resolutions, both of which are not in conflict with our By-Laws.:

- 1. We have agreed to have a onetime Life Membership promotion to celebrate the 80th Anniversary of our Alma Mater. Just for tonight, Life Membership is only \$100 less the amount you have already paid by installment.
- 2. We have agreed that the New Board elected on AGM will only take office at January 1 of the coming year. This will avoid the fact that we have no functional Board of Directors between AGM and the First Board meeting.

Having served the board as President for 2 years, I will step down by the end of this year. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the board members for their help and support, as well as the support from our Alma Mater in Hong Kong over the years.

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Association Held on Friday 14 October, 2016 at 6 pm At Spring Villa Chinese Cuisine 7301 Woodbine Ave., Markham, On L3R 3V7

The meeting was called to order by the Secretary at 6:05 pm.

The quorum (Minimum 10) was checked by asking members to raise their hands. The count was 18 at the time. (More members came in later.) The quorum was fulfilled.

The Meeting officially commenced. It was ensured that all members present were handed a copy of the 2016 AGM "hand-out" which included:

- Message from Professor Tong, President of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University,
- President's Report 2016,
- Minutes of Annual General Meeting 2015,
- Financial Statement as of June 30, 2016.
- Secretary Susan Wong presented the Minutes of Annual General Meeting 2015.
 Alan Ho moved to accept the Minutes of Annual General Meeting 2015 as presented.
 - Seconded by Paul Cheung. The floor was open for voting. 17 counts for the motion, 1 abstain. Motion carried.
- President Alan Ho presented the President's Report 2016.
 Tommy Chang moved to accept the President's Report 2016 as presented.
 Seconded by Steven Chung. 18 voted in favor. 0 against. Motion carried unanimously.
- Treasurer Steven Chung presented the Financial Report as of June 30, 2016.
 Ronnie Wong moved to accept the Financial Statement as of June 30, 2016 as presented.
 Seconded by Tommy Chang. 18 voted in favor. 0 against. Motion carried unanimously.
- Election of new (5) Directors.
 Susan Wong reported 4 board members would continue to stay in the board. They were: Mimie Chow, Steven Chung, Susan Wong and Elliot Tse.

There were 5 Board Members whose term of service was up., they were: Alan Ho, Albert Fok, SK Chung, Paul Cheung and Ronnie Wong.

The floor was handed over to Paul Cheung, Chair of the Nomination and Election Committee.

There were 5 candidates nominated this year, they are: Tommy Chang, Michael Shiu and Dr. Raymond Wong. Alan Ho and Albert Fok were seeking re-election and had not served the Board continuously for 6 years prior to this election.

Each candidate was given 15 minutes to introduce himself.

Alan Ho was not available at the time and his introduction was presented by Alice Ho.

Raymond Wong was also absent and Alex Tang did the introduction on Raymond's behalf.

No other applications for nomination were received before the meeting. As the number of candidates was equal to the number of openings. All candidates won by acclamation. All items concerning Nomination and Election had been discussed in the meeting and no other issue was raised.

Adam Keung moved and Steven Chung seconded to conclude the Nomination and Election Session. 2 more members had arrived and total 20 members voted in favor.
